REDUCTION ASSIGNMENT

To help you engage in close, interactive reading, you will be required to create a REDUCTION. Your REDUCTION must follow these specific guidelines:

- You are limited to one sheet of paper that you should turn <u>sideways</u>.
- o Somewhere on the page, you must include
- The **Title** and **Author** of work.
- All **characters** that you feel are important.
- Quotes that you consider significant.
- Symbols and Motifs* in the story.
- The THEME(S)**
- · Also, consider the following elements to include:
- How the setting helps to color the theme(s).
- The important points and episodes/situations that you feel are crucial to understanding theme(s).
- You will use NO complete sentences (except when citing quotes). You may draw pictures, use color, or whatever you feel is appropriate in conveying the work's meaning.

Simply *having* a reduction is <u>not</u> the goal. **CREATING** your reduction is! It is the **PROCESS** of *doing* that helps you learn and retain the story's content.

Your Reduction should <u>not</u> be a mere type of outline. It needs to be **VISUAL**. It should be an all-inclusive creative expression—your ready source for future reference (a.k.a. a glorified cheat-sheet)

* Motifs: Images, details, episodes or even words that recur throughout the story

^{**}Theme: How the story provides a shape or a form to the turmoil of human experience.
